

Conflict Minerals Policy 2021

In 2012 The Securities and Exchange Commission adopted rules to implement the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act of 2010 that excludes consumption of Conflict Minerals originating from Democratic Republic of Congo or the surrounding countries. Advanced Laser Inc. provides compliance for our public customers to these social rules and obligations through the supply chain. An industry adopted validation process of the documentation of smelters, names, mines and locations are contained within approved Conflict Free Smelters Program and disclosed through the Conflict Minerals Reporting system. This validation process is to assure that manufactured items that contain minerals of Tantalum, Tin, Gold or Tungsten do not originate from the Democratic Republic of Congo or its surrounding neighbors.

Advanced Laser certifies that, to the best of its knowledge based on reasonable inquiries with its suppliers, any conflict materials contained in product supplied by Advanced Laser do not originate from the DRC or adjoining countries, were derived from recycled or scrap sources, or were not necessary for the production or functionality of the product.
